| Post-Conquest (Joshua 24) | Maintaining the Blessing | Obedience is required not just to enter , but to stay in the land . |

How Does Our Calling and Assignment AND the Timing of Our Calling AND Assignment Prepare Us For the Work?

The timing of our calling is critical. God calls people in different seasons, and the fulfillment of that calling often unfolds in stages.

His timing is perfect, and our role is to trust, prepare, and obey.

Key Lessons:


- 1. Timing requires readiness; God prepares and affirms before He sends
- 2. The timing of your calling often requires stepping into unfamiliar territory. It takes faith and obedience.
- 3. God Calls in His timing, not ours
- 4. Delay in calling can happen due to disobedience





Identify Our Calling:
Our Calling is a Journey

Identifying our calling is not a one-time event but a journey. It unfolds as we seek God, use our gifts, recognize burdens, listen to wise counsel, and step out in faith.



Being Called vs. Being Sent

Understanding the Difference

- Being Called is when God chooses, appoints, or invites a person to fulfill a purpose.
- Being **Sent** is when God releases, commissions, or deploys a person to carry out that purpose.
- A person may be <u>called</u> before they are sent
- Being <u>sent</u> often requires preparation, equipping, and obedience.

Key Differences Between Being Called and Being Sent

| ASPECT | BEING CALLED | BEING SENT |
|-----------------------|--|--|
| Definition | A divine invitation to a purpose | A commissioning to fulfill that purpose |
| Timing | Happens first; may require waiting and preparation | Happens after equipping and readiness |
| Responsibility | Receiving and accepting the call | Obediently acting on the assignment |
| Scriptural Example | Jeremiah (Jeremiah 1:5) | Moses (Exodus 3:10) |
| Jesus' Example | Jesus was called as the Son of God | Jesus was sent into the world (John 20:21) |

Our Calling Require Preparation and Testing

Many times, before stepping into a calling, God prepares and refines us.

Example: Joseph (A Calling with Preparation)

- Joseph had dreams at 17 years old but became Egypt's governor at 30 years old (Genesis 37:2, 41:46).
- He endured betrayal, slavery, and prison before fulfilling his calling.

Trials and challenges refine and prepare you for your calling

Obedience is Key to Walking in Your Calling

Fulfilling your calling requires obedience to God's voice.

Scriptures:

- Joshua 1:9 (AMP) "Have I not commanded you? Be strong and courageous! Do not be terrified or dismayed, for the Lord your God is with you wherever you go."
- 1 Samuel 15:22 (AMP) "....Behold, to obey is better than sacrifice....."

Delayed obedience can delay your calling. When God calls, respond immediately.

Your Calling Can Be Rejected or Missed

Some people miss or reject their calling due to fear, sin, or disobedience.

Example: The Israelites (Delayed Calling to the Promised Land)

• They were called to enter Canaan, but their doubt and rebellion delayed them 40 years (Numbers 14:26-39).

Scripture:

- Matthew 22:14 (AMP) "For many are called [invited, summoned], but few are chosen."
- Jonah 1:1-3 (AMP) Jonah ran from his calling but was redirected by God.

Ignoring God's call can lead to unnecessary delays and missed opportunities.

How to Identify Your Calling

Identifying our calling requires a combination of spiritual discernment, biblical wisdom, and practical obedience.

- Seek God in prayer and fasting Daniel 9:3-19, Jer 29:12-13, Matt 7:7
- ✓ Listen for God's voice 1 Sam 2:1-10, Isaiah 30:21, John 10:27
- ✓ Identify your spiritual gifts Romans 12:6-8, 1 Peter 4:10
- Recognize your burden for a specific issue or people group Nehemiah 1:3-4, Matt 9:36, Isaiah 61:1
 - Pay attention to open doors Esther 4:14, Revelation 3:8, Proverbs 16:9
 - Seek confirmation through mentors Acts 13:2-3, Proverbs 11:14, Eccl 4:9-10
- **✓ Walk in obedience and take action** Gen 12:1-4, James 2:17, Hebrews 11:8

Step 1: Discover Your Calling

6 Steps:

How to properly discern your calling, identify your spiritual gifts, and recognize when you are being sent

- Pray and seek God's guidance (Jeremiah 29:11-13).
- Identify what burdens your heart.
- Ask: Am I called to build, proclaim, serve, or lead?
- Example: Jeremiah was called before birth (Jeremiah 1:5).

Step 2: Identify Your Five-Fold Ministry Function

- Is the Holy Spirit calling you as: Apostle, Prophet, Evangelist, Pastor, or Teacher? (Ephesians 4:11-16).
- Get counsel from mentors and church leaders.
- Example: Paul was called as an Apostle and went through a season of preparation (Galatians 1:15-18).

Step 3: Recognize Your Spiritual Gifts

6 Steps:

How to properly discern your calling, identify your spiritual gifts, and recognize when you are being sent

- Study 1 Corinthians 12, Romans 12, Ephesians 4.
- Take a spiritual gifts assessment.
- Example: Timothy was sent as a pastor and teacher with the gift of leadership (1 Tim. 4:12).

Step 4: Submit to Preparation and Training

- Every calling requires a season of preparation.
- Grow in knowledge, character, and faith.

6 Steps:

How to properly discern your calling, identify your spiritual gifts, and recognize when you are being sent

Step 5: Wait for the Sending

- Allow God to open the right doors.
- Expect confirmation from leaders, mentors, and God's timing.
- Example: Jesus waited until the right time to begin His public ministry (Luke 3:23).

Step 6: Walk in Obedience

- When we are sent, move forward in faith.
- Example: The disciples were sent after receiving power from the Holy Spirit (Acts 1:8).



Every believer has a calling – seek it.

Every calling needs spiritual gifts — develop them.

Every calling leads to a sending — be ready.

Five-fold ministry and spiritual gifts work together — align with God's purpose.

- Do I know my calling?
- Which Five-Fold Ministry am I called to?
- Which spiritual gifts do I have?
- Am I in the preparation phase, or is God sending me?

By aligning calling, being sent, five-fold ministry, and spiritual gifts, we will walk in the fullness of our divine assignment!
